St. Ann's Cape Breton - From Kitchens to Ceilidhs and Square Dances, the Cape Breton fiddle has taken center stage around the world. Nowhere is it appreciated more than at home. When fiddlers get together, they share stories and tunes and such has been the case since the first Cape Breton Fiddle Festival in 1973. Once again this August, the 34th Festival, organized by the Cape Breton Fiddlers Association, will gather at its adopted home, the Gaelic College of Celtic Arts and Crafts in St. Ann's.

The Fiddle festival will include a series of workshops and concerts on both days. Workshops to be announced shortly. Full concession facilities will be available throughout the weekend with plenty of free parking. Watercolour Workshop with Bill Rogers cswpc & Chris Gorey cspwc

Sunday August 24 – Wednesday August 27, 2008

Join us at the Gaelic College in beautiful St. Ann's for this three-day workshop retreat.

Your registration fee includes:

Sunday – evening reception and accommodations.

Monday – full day of instruction, breakfast, lunch, supper, breaks and accommodations.

Tuesday – full day of instruction, breakfast, lunch, supper, breaks and accommodations.

Wednesday – 1/2 day of instruction, final critique and wrap up, breakfast, lunch, and break.

Course Information:

Plein-air Landscapes with Chris Gorey cspwc: Topics covered will be Methods and Materials used in plein air watercolour painting; How to isolate and simplify the landscape; value relationships, design and colour harmonies and mixing.

A discussion of watercolour materials as well as learning to see shapes and simplifying the landscape as it applies to Plein air painting. This will be illustrated in conjunction with an outdoor demonstration.

Individual attention will be given. Each day will be completed with a final critique and wrap up.

The Figure in Watercolour with Bill Rogers cspwc: Topics covered will include drawing, proportion, composition, values, and mixing colour. Students will work from a live model and Bill will demonstrate his approach to painting the figure including how to start and how to be conscious of negative space and its effect on the placement of the figure on the paper. Students will then work on their own with individual help from the instructors. A critique will complete each days work
